## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### Hello everyone:

I hope this newsletter finds you all well. The year is flying by and we are pushing towards the middle of it when our memberships are due at the end of the financial year. Please make sure you pay your renewal by Friday, 31st May to be entitled to your \$20 discount. Reminders are enclosed with this newsletter.

I would like to say a special thank you to Ben. The last Runs Calendar was full of varied and interesting trips and I hope you all got the chance to enjoy at least one of them. As I'm typing this I'm sure he is preparing our next calendar which I know will be just as good. Just a reminder that next Sunday, 5<sup>th</sup> May is our regular Beeac Coffee 'n Cars. It's a nice relaxing morning so if you get the chance please drop by.

I was checking over my car yesterday and had a good look at the tyres. Thankfully they were all okay, but they are definitely something we should all keep an eye on. I have witnessed the damage a blown tyre can do to cars, not to mention the danger to the driver, passengers and other road users it can cause. As our collectable cars are not usually our daily commuter it is not unusual for there to be plenty of tread left but the tyre sidewall can be deteriorating. As a general guide, most manufacturers recommend replacing tyres when they are over 6 years from the date of manufacture. Some 'experts' even suggest 5 years, but in reality, there are many tyres that are being driven on which are well over this age. There is no legal definitive age limit as to when you should replace them. For your own safety though please keep a close eye on their condition, in particular, when they start getting older than 5 years. Tyre ageing is commonly identified by small cracks, known as crazing, which appear on the tyre sidewall.

To tell the age of a tyre manufactured after 2000 check on the side wall for a 10 to 12 digit serial number. They usually start with the letters DOT and end in 4 numbers. It is the numbers we are interested in. The first two numbers indicate the week of the year the tyre was manufactured, and the last two indicate the year. If your tyre has only three numbers this means that it was made prior to the year 2000 so is over 19 years old. I would suggest that it is well past its use by date! So please be safe and have a thorough check before driving.

#### REMINDERS TO CLUB PERMIT HOLDERS

#### Club permit holders must:

- ensure that the vehicle is only used for private use and is not used for commercial use;
- ensure they are familiar with their particular club's requirements for club permit holders;
- ensure they are familiar with the log book requirements;
- maintain their vehicles in a manner which ensures that the vehicle is in a 'safe' condition for use on a highway;
- present their vehicle for periodic safety checks if prescribed by their club, or in the case of street rods, if prescribed by the Australian Street Rod Federation;
- maintain financial membership of the club at all times whilst holding a club permit;
- ensure that the log book and permit is carried in the vehicle at all times the vehicle is in use;
- ensure that the number plate(s) and windscreen label as issued by us are correctly displayed on the vehicle at all times when the vehicle is in use.

Members are also reminded that all new Vic Roads Club Permit Scheme vehicles and motorcycles listed under the Colac Collectable Car Club Inc must provide their permit number and photographs of the vehicle or motorcycle to the club. These must be supplied to the Club Safety Officer and Scrutineer prior to the vehicle being driven. As stated in the Club Permit Agreement with Vic Roads, Clubs must:-

Maintain a register of dated photographs for all vehicles for which an initial club permit is sought. Dated photographs must include images of the front, driver's side, rear, driving position (side on with the driver's door open) and, where possible, any identifiers such as chassis number and engine number. Where a club permit application for a motor cycle is made, the club must take photographs of both sides of the motor cycle, a photograph of the rear, and where possible, of identifiers such as engine and frame numbers. Clubs are required to provide photographs to VicRoads within seven days of receipt of a written request from VicRoads.

## NAMES IN THE AUTOMOTIVE INDUSTRY

- 1. Buick, David A plumbing inventor and manufacturer built his first car in 1900.
- 2. Cadillac, Antoine Founded the City of Detroit in the 17th century.
- 3. Chevrolet, Louis A Swiss race car driver and engineer built his first car in 1911 with financing by William Durant.
- 4. Chrysler, Walter A locomotive mechanic who got into the automobile business in 1912 and publicly displayed his own my first car at the 1924 NY Auto Show and selling an amazing 32,000 cars in his first year.
- 5. Cord, E.L. As General Manager of Auburn Auto Company he produced some of the most advanced (front-wheel drive, supercharged V8's) and beautiful cars ever under his own name. Unfortunately, they were expensive and came along during the start of the Depression.
- 6. **Daimler**, Gottlieb can be considered as the founder of the automobile industry when he formed Daimler Motor Company in 1890.
- 7. **Dodge, John & Horace** Their first car came off the assembly line in 1914. Both brothers died within less than a year of each other during the influenza epidemic in 1920.
- 8. **Durant**, **William** A businessman, finance man, and salesman who was a self-made millionaire before ever joining the auto business. He was called on by the owners of the failing Buick Motor Company to help. He soon bought Oldsmobile, Pontiac and Cadillac and formed General Motors. He almost bought Ford, but didn't come up with enough cash to suit Henry. Durant always kept himself stretched thin with his money in stocks and other businesses. He lost everything in the Depression.
- 9. **Duryea**, Charles & Frank Built the first successful American automobile and the first to offer a production model for sale to the public.
- 10. Earl, Harley Designed the La Salle in 1927, the beginning of a trend towards lower and wider cars. As head of GM's styling department he invented the tail fin and designed the Corvette.
- 11. **Ferrari**, **Enzo** A mechanic, race car driver then race car team owner. His cars dominated racing for many years after WWII.
- 12. Firestone, Harvey His tyres went on the first mass-produced Fords.
- 13. Ford, Henry In creating the assembly line for automobiles he also created jobs for thousands and affordable cars for millions. What Henry did for automobiles spilled over into other consumer goods.
- 14. **Gale**, **Tom** A Chrysler designer largely responsible for the current crop of Chrysler's design of cab-forward and curved styling on everything from the minivan to the Viper.
- 15. Goodrich, BF The company started in 1896 has many firsts: First synthetic rubber tyre, first tubeless tyre, first American-made radial tyre, the first space saver spare and the first "run flat" tyre.

## NAMES IN THE AUTOMOTIVE INDUSTRY

- 16. Goodyear, Charles Accidentally discovered the rubber vulcanizing process. He patented the process, but couldn't come up with any practical uses for it and died penniless in 1860. The Goodyear Tyre and Rubber Company was named after him.
- 17. Honda, Soichiro After WWII with \$3,300 he started making motorcycles.
- 18. **Iacocca**, **Lee** Responsible for the **Mustang** in the early 1960's and bailing out Chrysler in early 1980's.
- 19. **Jellinek**, **Emile** In 1900, while a Daimler Motor Works board member, Jellinek convinced Gottlieb Daimler to build a race car and name it after Emile's daughter, **Mercedes**.
- 20. **Murphy, Edward** Founded the Pontiac Buggy Company in Pontiac, MI in 1893. At the turn of the century he decided to switch to making "those noisy, smelly, unreliable automobiles."
- 21. Olds, Ransom His highly successful "Curved Dash" runabout put Michigan on the map as a source of motor vehicles. He soon left his namesake company. Later he produced the first gasoline lawn mower.
- 22. **Porsche, Ferdinand** A design engineer who never created a car carrying his name. That was left to his son, Ferry, to accomplish.
- 23. Royce, Frederick & Rolls, Charles Engineer Royce and car dealer Rolls introduced their first car in 1904.
- 24. **Sloan**, **Alfred** Led GM to become the world's largest corporation. Responsible for the idea of yearly styling changes.
- 25. **Tucker**, **Preston** After WWII Tucker designed, built and promoted an innovative car with features, power, and aerodynamic design never before seen and at a very good price. His company folded after building 51 cars.
