




Tech talk:

Now that we are coming out of winter and getting ready to get those cars out, it is time to check the brakes. Start by removing wheels and checking the wear of the brake pads/shoes, at the same time checking each slave cylinder and master cylinder for any leaks. Replace any defect parts. If the brake fluid hasn't been changed for a few years now would be the time to replace it. If you are not confident of doing this, take to a mechanic and have him do it for you. This is a crucial part of the cars safety. As most cars haven't been out for a few months the brakes can be seized or sticky, you don't want this to cause you or anyone else any harm.

Reminder:

Check that your red permit scheme registration is paid and the label is affixed to the windscreen in the bottom left hand corner. Make sure you have the **log book** in the car and **filled out** each time the car is used.

Botheration, "said Andrew", It's not just one car. Its hundreds of them".




The man looked at her with disdain and replied, "That's what you can do when you're young and bright".
