A WORD FROM OUR PRESIDENT (Continues)

We have been taking our cars to Paatsch Automotive in Colac for some time now, so we had the Kombi dropped off there to be checked out. The owner Gavin, who is one of our members, checked it out for us. He very quickly discovered that the distributor was loose and had moved putting the timing out. A bit of adjustment and she fired up. Thankfully an easy fix. So much for the skills of the RACV mechanic. We left the van with Gavin to do the roadworthy for the Club Permit.

I then received a phone call from Gavin telling me that the Australian Compliance plate had the seating capacity for the van listed as 2. Being a transporter, it had 8 seats which seemed really strange. I checked the chassis number and the van was definitely manufactured as a 'Kombi', which stands for combination van. (The German word for combination starts with a K.) With a combination van you can have either 8 passengers or remove either one or two of the rear seats and use it to transport goods.

After contacting some other Kombi owners, I discovered that it was not uncommon for the 1973 Kombi Compliance Plates to only have seating capacity for 2 listed. Maybe the rear seats were not fitted until after they were imported. I'm not sure. Anyway, off to Melbourne with the van on a trailer to see an Engineer to have our rear seats certified. All went well and looked like it was an easy tick off until he went to look at the Compliance Plate which is located behind the driver's seat. The van had been updated with inertia reel seat belts in the front and the brackets used to fix them to the van did not comply so he wouldn't issue a certificate. *Bugger*!! Not happy, as it was only the back seats that he was supposed to be checking...

On return to Colac, we dropped into see Damien at Genua Brothers Steel Fabrication who made us some new compliant brackets straight away. A 5-minute job to fit them and back to the engineer for the final tick off. All part of the fun and learning curve.

You'll get to see the van on one of our runs soon. Take care and stay safe. Ken (President)


