PRESIDENT’S REPORT

Hello Everyone,

I hope everyone is coping okay through our new COVID-19 restrictions. Hopefully we will see an end to them soon.

Some of you may be aware that I have been working in Melbourne for the last month. I am currently co-ordinating and overseeing the security and police response at one of the Health Quarantine Hotels. It is a strange and different environment to work in. As you can imagine there are many stringent processes and procedures that are required to be followed. Instead of writing something about cars for this newsletter, I thought some of our members might be interested in hearing a brief insight of what goes on in our quarantine hotels.

The hotel I am working in has a number of COVID-19 positive cases and people who have symptoms but have not yet tested positive. They are made up from a combination of overseas arrivals and local community positive cases related to the current outbreak. The hotel is divided up, floor by floor. Positive cases and suspected positive cases are on separate floors. These floors are classed as “red zones”. The ‘guests’ are restricted to their individual rooms and are not permitted to leave them or even open the room entry doors. Any item that is removed from a ‘guest’ room is completely sealed in plastic bags to be either sanitised or disposed of. Waste materials are deposited in specific waste disposal bins that are located in a separate secured area.

The entry to these red zones is strictly restricted to trained personnel who must wear full personal protection equipment (PPE). The face mask worn with this PPE is a different type to the surgical type ones that we all commonly wear. They are personally fitted and are shaped to form a complete seal to ensure there are no gaps for the virus to enter. The procedures that have to be followed when a person is donning (putting on PPE) and doffing (taking off PPE) are very specific and requires numerous hand sanitising during the process.

The floors where the support services are based are classified as “green zones”. Masks must still be worn in green zones. Every contact surface is cleaned hourly with disinfectant by the cleaning staff in the green zones. There are also specific red and green elevators. The red elevators are used solely by the guests and are completely sanitized between each use. The green elevators are used by the staff. When a guest either arrives or departs the hotel the whole hotel becomes a red zone and there is no other movement in or out allowed. The hotel does not re-open until the entire reception area is sanitised. Every person working in the quarantine hotel system must undertake a daily COVID test, including on their days off.



The staff working in the hotel come from varying organisations and work 24 hours a day 7 days a week on a roster system. There is a large medical team; police and protective services personnel, Australian Defence Force (ADF), Department of Health Authorised Officers, hotel support staff and cleaners. There are also full-time safety officers roving around the building to make sure there are no breaches to any of the safety precautions.

There has been a lot of negative media about our hotel quarantine. Initially there was obviously some slack procedures that caused our dramatic outbreak in Melbourne last year when private security was being used. Things have changed since then, and in my time here, I have nothing but praise for the workers. They are working in very difficult circumstances and although each organisation has differing dynamics and operating procedures, they have come together in a co-ordinated effort to contain the virus and keep our community safe.

My stint in here is almost over. Once that is done and I have passed my final COVID-19 test, hopefully we will have some good weather and I can catch up with you all on a run soon.

As you will read in the Minutes of the club's last meeting, Billy Bubb sustained unbelievable injuries while riding his motorbike along a beach in Beachport, South Australia. Instead of enjoying another New Year's Eve ride, which Billy did with friends on a regular basis, Billy jumped over a washout, something he had done many times before. Upon landing, Billy went over the handlebars, landing face first onto the sand. His legs bent backwards up his back, severing his spinal cord and braking several vertebrae, his ribs and scapula.

Billy was flown to Adelaide Royal Hospital requiring life support and was eventually returned to a Melbourne hospital. Billy is now awake and able to communicate but will never walk again and has moderate brain damage. Billy continues to work hard on his rehabilitation and the Colac Collectable Car Club is proud to support Billy and his family.

Steve is a member of the club and his son, Billy, received horrific injuries when riding in South Australia on New Year's Eve. Billy was transferred to Mt Gambier Hospital, airlifted to Adelaide and eventually returned to Melbourne. Billy's injuries will mean that he will remain in hospital for over 2 years. A long road ahead for all his family as Billy will require ongoing care. Three weeks ago, "Billy's Day by the Bay" (a car show and get-together) was held and this raised over \$22,000. A request was made to the club to donate to "Billy's Battle" Appeal as Billy was riding a non-registered motorcycle and no insurance was available. SNIPPETS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE ASSOCIATION OF MOTORING CLUBS (AOMC) DELEGATE'S MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 24TH MAY, 2021

- 77 delegates were present, representing 65 clubs.
- Guest speakers from RACV and Beyond Blue were attendance;
- Nicole from RACV acknowledged that some false information had been circulating about RACV and the Historical Motoring Movement. RACV still have a commitment to historic motoring. The Motoring Interests program has been running for 15 years, and over \$3 million has been put into the movement.
- Leon from Beyond Blue spoke on how the organisation strives to reduce the stigma associated with mental illness. Leon quoted statistics such as 3 million people in Australia suffer from anxiety or depression. Beyond Blue recommend that if you are feeling unwell talk to somebody, a friend, your general practitioner or Beyond Blue.
- There are currently 245 clubs affiliated members of the AOMC.
- The VicRoads/Club Permit Scheme review has been postponed. There has been a problem with the supply of logbooks and computer problems when paying annual renewals with VicRoads.
- Winton Historics – congratulations passed onto the Austin 7 club on the way the club ran the Covid-19 restricted attendance 2021 event.

I am writing to advise that we have allocated your recent donation to the purchase of a portable oxygen concentrator for the Palliative Care team.

An oxygen concentrator is an electronic device which takes room air and passes it through a filter, removing nitrogen and other elements from the air and leaving a higher concentration of oxygen.

It helps to reduce breathlessness in patients who have low levels of oxygen in their blood.

The clients most likely to benefit are those experiencing respiratory illness such as lung cancer, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease and pulmonary fibrosis.

The use of an oxygen concentrator will provide significant benefits to our Palliative Care clients and result in fewer presentations to Urgent Care.
