It was a 1923 Citroen 5CV. A small 2-seater with a dovetail rear end. It is a replica of a Citroen that two men, Nevill Westwood and Greg Davies, drove when they circumnavigated Australia in 1925. Quite a feat at that time. These men originally set off from Perth and headed north with the intention to drive to Darwin. If they were to make it that far they would be the first to do that trip in a motor vehicle of any kind, let alone almost a toy looking 856cc four-cylinder engine vehicle that produced a whole 11 horsepower. They nicknamed their car "Bubsie" and set off on their way. The men travelled through largely unexplored outback areas with little to no roads, from deserts to thick bushland.



After they successfully made it to Darwin, Nevill and Greg had the taste of adventure and decided instead of returning straight back to Perth the way they came, as per their original plan, they would continue on their journey by taking the long way home, circumnavigating the whole of Australia. An amazing feat with no GPS, reliable maps and a largely unexplored outback. They were successful in their circumnavigation and entered the history books as the first men to circumnavigate Australia in a motor vehicle. A magnificent feat for the time!

Before I go, I just wanted to wish everyone a safe and Happy Christmas and New Year and I look I forward to catching up with you on a run soon.

RENEWING YOUR VICROADS PERMIT

If you need your vehicle/motorcycle VicRoads permit renewal signed, the best way is to forward your permit to the club's Post Office Box 346, Colac. 3250

Please enclose a stamped envelope with your name and address; so that the signed permit can be returned to you. Our permit officers will sign the permit and return it to you (do not include the log book). Club members are reminded that when you need your VicRoads permit renewed, if you cannot post it to the club's post office box, please

phone one of the club's Permit Scheme Officers to make a time to drop off the permit renewal.

Do not just turn up as this may be an inconvenience to the Permit Scheme Officer.

As a courtesy, phone first. You will then be able to pick up the signed permit renewal the next day; or when it has been signed. Permits can also be renewed at our Club Meetings.

If you are applying for a new permit, please make sure you have all the necessary paperwork before you contact the Scrutineer. Refer to the Vic Roads website for all relevant information.

And a notice to members paying their permit renewals at a VicRoads branch.

On a couple of occasions recently, VicRoads have rejected the renewal due to not having the correct
'Club Permit Officer' signature on the renewal.

Our current club details are correct and have been lodged with VicRoads.

Please ask the VicRoads service person to check all three pages of our authorised permit officer forms as some VicRoads employees are only looking at one page and not the three pages.

So, if VicRoads reject your renewal and mention that you haven't got the right signature on the renewal - ask them to please check all pages of our club forms.

FRANCIS & BARNETT

Just one of the many motorcycle marques on our club register.

Francis & Barnett Limited was an English motorcycle manufacturer from 1919 to 1966. Gordon Inglesby Francis and Arthur Barnett founded the company, which was based in Lower Ford Street, Coventry, until 1962. In 1947, Associated Motor Cycles (AMC) took over Francis-Barnett. In 1957, AMC merged Francis-Barnett with James in Birmingham; and in 1962, Francis-Barnett production moved to the James factory. In 1966 Manganese Bronze Holdings took over AMC, and terminated production of both Francis-Barnett and James.

Francis-Barnett motorcycles were built with small engines, up to 350 cc (21 cu in), for affordable private transport and for use in motorcycle sport. Most Francis-Barnett motorcycles were built with Villiers two-stroke engines, until in 1959 AMC introduced its own range of single-cylinder two-stroke engines, made in-house, for both Francis-Barnett and James motorcycles.

The first new Francis–Barnett motorcycle had a J.A.P. 292cc side valve engine; two-speed Sturmey-Archer gearbox; and bright red and black fuel tank. Production costs were an early problem.

In the late 1950s, AMC tried to dispense with buying engines from Villiers by commissioning Italian engineer Vincenzo Piatti to design a new range of single-cylinder two-stroke engines. They were to be made in four sizes: 150cc; 175cc; 200cc and 250cc. AMC knew Piatti from his innovative, but commercially unsuccessful, Piatti scooter. AMC constrained Piatti by specifying low cost rather than quality. This led Piatti to devise to a conservative design. The engines were poorly manufactured by AMC, and soon gained a reputation for unreliability.

In 1962, AMC closed the Francis-Barnett factory in Coventry, and moved production to the James factory at Greet, Birmingham. Some Francis-Barnett staff were transferred to James. The James and Francis-Barnett ranges became almost identical, badge-engineered with differences only in colour and name. The last new Francis-Barnett model was launched in 1962, the newly-designed Fulmar with a spine frame, pressed steel body, leading link fork, and 149cc AMC engine. Francis-Barnett production ended 4 August 1966 when Manganese Bronze Holdings took over AMC.

Both Francis-Barnett and James ceased to exist from October of that year.



There are plans a foot for a few more short local trips away and a visit to the Harrow Light Show in Harrow hopefully, in November 2026.





The Oldsmobile "Cutlass"

The Oldsmobile Cutlass was a series of automobiles produced by General Motors' Oldsmobile division between 1961 and 1999. At its introduction, the Cutlass was Oldsmobile's entry-level model; it began as a unibody compact car, but saw its greatest success as a body-on-frame intermediate. The Cutlass was named after Vought F7U Cutlass.



Introduced as the top trim level in Oldsmobile's compact F-85 Series, the Cutlass evolved into a distinct series of its own, spawning numerous variants. These included the 4-4-2 muscle car in 1964, the upscale Cutlass Supreme in 1966, the high -performance Hurst/Olds in 1968, and the Vista Cruiser station wagon.

By the 1980s, Oldsmobile was using the Cutlass as a sub-marque, with numerous vehicle lines bearing the name simultaneously. The compact Cutlass Calais, mid-size Cutlass Ciera, Cutlass Cruiser station wagon, and flagship midsize Cutlass Supreme were among the models available during this time.

In the 1990s, Oldsmobile began moving away from its traditional model lines, with other legacy vehicle nameplates like the 98 and 88 being discontinued in 1996 and 1999, respectively. The Cutlass name was likewise retired in 1999 in favour of the all-new Oldsmobile Alero, ending nearly 40 years of continuous Cutlass production

Oldsmobile first used the Cutlass name on an experimental-sports coupe designed in 1954. It rode a 110 in (2,800 mm) wheelbase, and featured a dramatic boat-tailed fastback roofline and stock V8. Its platform was similar to the compact F-85 introduced seven years later. General Motors began developing its first compact cars in 1956, beginning with initial planning on what would become the Chevrolet Corvair in 1960 on the GM Z platform. The following year a second series of somewhat longer cars was planned for Buick, Oldsmobile, and Pontiac; what would be termed "senior compacts" on the "Y" platform. They would share the same body shell and lightweight engine. Oldsmobile designer Irv Rybicki began work on the Olds model in 1957. It finally went on sale in 1960 as a 1961 model.

Colac Collectable Car Club has one Oldsmobile Cutlass; 1973 model:-

The Cutlass line was redesigned for 1973 using GM's new "Colonnade" A-body platform. The model lineup consisted of the base Cutlass, Cutlass "S", Cutlass Supreme, Cutlass Salon, Vista Cruiser station wagon, and the 4-4-2 appearance package on the Cutlass "S" colonnade coupe. While rooflines were shared with other GM divisions, the Cutlass bodies had two Oldsmobile-specific convex creases—one starting behind the front wheel and running rear ward into the door and curving upward at its trailing end, and the other curving down just ahead of the rear wheel and continued by the crease line of the quarter panel behind the rear wheel. The Cutlass "S" and 4-4-2 offered optional "Strato" bucket seats with high seatbacks and built-in head restraints; these seats could be swivelled 90 degrees to permit easier entry and exit for the driver and front passenger.
