

The Birregurra car show was held on the 16th February, and I entered my 1925 Model TT Ford truck (TT meaning 'ton truck').

I have owned this truck for about 5 years. It was an unfinished project that I purchased from New South Wales, sight unseen. I first saw a photographs and a few videos, which made me interested in the purchase. I also own a Model T Ford Tourer that I fully restored, so I am familiar with Model T Fords, inside and out. After getting the truck delivered by a tilt tray company who also purchased another car from another purchaser from Melbourne, I started going over things that needed sorted and got it running properly with some repairs and adjustments. I was testing the TT around the farm lane ways with a top speed of 35 kms per hour. TT Fords have the same engine and front axle as a car; the truck has a heavier chassis and a worm drive differential. There are two options for differential ratios; with mine having the low ratio 2-speed differential. This was the ratio for carrying heavy loads; with the high-speed ratio it is 48 kms per hour.

People see the lever coming out the floor and think it's a gear lever, but it is actually the hi and low speed for the differential. The Model T Ford has a planetary gearbox with pedals hi and low speed. Press the pedal down is low and let it out it is high. The middle pedal is reverse and the right pedal is brakes which work on the transmission drum to start the engine. The park brake lever has two functions; one is all the way back to activate and the rear park brake shows, and the other function is neutral place. The park brake is in the middle and all the way forward to engage the clutch.

I have driven the truck quite a few times to Cressy Airfield and around the Beeac area, but to go to Birregurra was its first big trip. I allowed an extra hour to travel to Birregurra. I needed to drive a section of the Princes Highway. I was a bit concerned the day before but I didn't have any problems.





ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

Colac Collectable Car Club Inc annual membership renewals will be sent out in the next couple of months.

Please remember that to use your vehicle on the Club Permit Scheme with VicRoads, vehicle owners must be current financial members of a car club authorised by VicRoads. If your club membership has lapsed, and not renewed within 30 days from 30th June, 2025 you are in breach of the requirements of the Club Permit Scheme and you are not legally entitled to use your vehicle on the road.

VicRoads will be notified on 31st July, 2025 if your membership has not been paid. Please remember, your membership renewal will be posted to all members (not emailed) and you should receive them during April/May.

"Early bird renewals" are payable from 1st May to 31st May.

All other payments must be paid by 30th June, 2025. If you do not receive your renewal in the mail, contact the club asap.
