RENEWING YOUR VICROADS PERMIT

To renew your VicRoads permit, send it to the club's Post Office Box 346, Colac. 3250

Please enclose a stamped envelope with your name and address; so that the signed permit can be returned to you. Our permit officers will sign the permit and return it to you (do not include the log book).

Club members are reminded that when you need your VicRoads permit renewed, if you cannot post it to the club's post office box, please


phone one of the club's Permit Scheme Officers to make a time to drop off the permit renewal.

Do not just turn up to have your permit renewed as this may be an inconvenience to the Permit Scheme Officer. As a courtesy, phone first. You will then be able to pick up the signed permit renewal the next day; or when it has been signed. Permits can also be renewed at our Club Meetings.

If you are applying for a new permit, please make sure you have all the necessary paperwork before you contact the Scrutineer. Refer to the Vic Roads website for all relevant information.

And a notice to all members renewing their permit – please make sure that all information on the permit renewal is correct (eg your name, address, club name etc).

AIR FORCE

A LITTLE MORE ABOUT THE WINJEEL

This plane is part of the Royal Australian Air Force Museum's heritage aircraft fleet.

It was completed in September 1956; was test flown at Avalon by the Commonwealth Aircraft Corporation (CAC), before issue to No 1 Aircraft Depot at RAAF Laverton on 4th November, 1956. On 21st November, the aircraft was delivered to No 1 Basic Flying Training School at Uranquinty, in a training role. In June 1957, the aircraft was allotted to Base Squadron Edinburgh for use by the Air Trials Unit. After servicing by Maintenance Squadron Edinburgh, the aircraft went to Woomera, again with the Air Trials Unit.

The Winjeel then returned to Point Cook for modifications, before returning to Woomera in December, 1958. In March, 1961, whilst still at No 1 Air Trials Unit, the aircraft carried out a forced landing due to engine failure, and sustained minor damage. During March, 1964 the aircraft was transferred to No 2 Air Trials Unit at Edinburgh until January, 1965 when the aircraft was allotted to No 1 Basic Flying Training School, now at Point Cook.

In December, 1965, the aircraft returned to Fishermen's Bend for servicing by CAC. Returning to Point Cook in April, it alternated between storage and operational use with No 1 Flying Training School, as the unit was now called, to evenly spread flying hours across the Winjeel fleet. In August, 1972, the Winjeel was transferred to East Sale, returning to Point Cook in March, 1973. In August, 1977, with the retirement of the Winjeel in the training role, the aircraft was converted to a training aid, and issued to the RAAF School of Technical Training at Wagga Wagga.

In April, 1994, the Winjeel was transported by road to Winrye Aviation, Bankstown Airport for partial restoration, which was completed in January 1995. Eventually it was ferried back to Point Cook via Wagga. The restoration was finished off and test flying completed by January 1996. This Winjeel has been operated by the RAAF Museum Historic Flight in displays since that time.

Phillip Island GP Circuit

We recently spent some time on Phillip Island and visited the Museum which contained many race bikes and some iconic Aussie race cars.

The Circuit site was purchased in 1952 and opened in 1956 for racing. It has had numerous owners and many \$millions spent over the years. It was completely refurbished in 1998 at a cost of \$5m. Linfox (the tracks current owners) spent a further \$3m, including resurfacing the whole track and is currently one of two tracks in Australia to have a FIM cat - a licence allowing the highest level of motorcycle racing worldwide. It also has FIM Grade 3 accreditation for car racing.

In 1973, the late Peter Brock won the Manufacturers Championship for the Holden Dealer Team on the track. The track has both a museum and replica go-kart track which is open to the public. There are also ride days, advanced riding and driving days, along with safety courses.

One of these days was put on by Westfalia Milking Machines and BMW was a sponsor supplying a full range of their motorcycles. There were a number of instructors riding BMW GS's (a trail Bike) giving us guidance throughout the day. Annette and I attended and had a choice of three rides on different BMW's and three rides on our own bikes throughout the day. Even on knobby tyres the instructors cruised past us on corners and easily lapped most of the participants (mainly dairy farmers) in a few laps, even though they had a top speed of only 170kph.

Most of the bikes we rode exceeded 200kph and I recall seeing an indicated 230kph on the speedo on one occasion. Sadly, BMW withdrew their support for this event due, at least partly, to the cost of tyres.

If you are visiting Phillip Island then it is well worth a visit to the museum or go-kart track. It is a pity it looks like future Motor Cycle Grand Prix events will move to Adelaide in 2028.





A Little Poem for Seniors, so true it hurts
