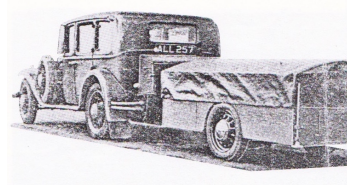

## **NABIAC - THE NATIONAL MOTOR CYCLE MUSEUM**

On our way home from sailing in Queensland we came across this museum between Port Macquarie and Newcastle in New South Wales.

The museum has over 1050 motorcycles from all over the world, covering the early 1920's up until the late model bikes.

It was interesting in that there were a number of bikes I had never heard of including Kenilworth, Militaire, Iver Johnson and many more. I have had quite a few bikes over the years and while the exact model may not have been on display, all brands I have had such as Bridgestone, Hodaka and Baja were represented.

The range of Japanese bikes was extensive and there were also some interesting record-breaking bikes like the 47cc Yamaha that broke land speed records for the 50, 75 and 100cc class in Western Australia. Overall, the bike achieved 24 land speed records.

The Museum also had a number of cars for those not interested in bikes. We spent an hour or two reminiscing over past bikes and the good and bad times we had on them.

Anyone in the area should put this Museum on their 'to do list' as the range of displays was outstanding.

## **VICROADS PART PRIVATISED FROM MORNINGTON NEWSLETTER (2022 – 2023)**

---

A consortium has agreed to pay \$7.9 billion to enter a joint venture with the Victorian Government to partly operate VicRoads for the next 40 years. Here's how it may impact you.

Novice drivers will soon be able to complete their online Probationary and Learner tests for free, with safe drivers also getting a 25 per cent discount off the cost of their license renewal as part of a \$7.9 billion deal with the State government. As outlined in the deal announced on June 30, a consortium will operate the Registration and Licensing (R&L) and Custom Plates (CP) arms of VicRoads for the next 40 years. However, the State government will retain control of drivers' data and privacy, pricing regulation of fees and services, and all regulation and policy changes. Vic Roads' R&L division is responsible for licensing more than five million drivers across Victoria, along with maintaining the registration of more than six million cars, motorbikes, commercial vehicles and trailers. Safe drivers will be rewarded with a 25 per cent discount on the licence renewal fee.

## **VICROADS PART PRIVATISED (Continued)**

The fine print the consortium - comprised of superannuation funds Aware Super and Australian Retirement Trust, along with global asset manager Macquarie Asset Management – will bolster VicRoads' IT infrastructure and operations as part of a joint venture.

The deal will see the consortium manage the R&L and CP arms of VicRoads for the next 40 years, which will then revert back to the control of the state government unless a further agreement is made. While the consortium has agreed to pay \$7.9 billion up front, it is not clear at this point exactly how they will recoup their investment, but it is understood they will charge the Victorian government a percentage of transactions made. No existing jobs will be lost as part of the new deal, with the Victorian Ombudsman and Victorian Information Commissioner to provide oversight of the joint venture. The proceeds of the \$7.9 billion deal will see the State government ease some of the financial pressure and mounting debt caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. The funds will be invested into the new Victorian Future Fund to help manage climbing debt and invest in future projects.

Learner and Probationary drivers will save \$51.40 and \$133.40 respectively.

### **Safe Driver Discount program**

As part of the agreement for the new joint venture, new incentives and discounts will be rolled out to existing and aspiring motorists to both make access to getting a licence easier, and staying safe once getting it.

### **Safe driving incentive**

The Safe Driver Discount program will reward good behaviour behind the wheel to those who avoid breaking road laws. Licence holders of all car, motorcycle, and heavy vehicles who are able to maintain a clean driving record and not lose any demerit points (or break road safety offences) for three years prior to the time of their licence renewal will receive a 25 per cent discount on their next renewal. This latest incentive will be introduced in late October of 2022 and will be in place until 2026. Learner permits in order to acquire a Learners Drivers permit, applicants need to complete the Learner Permit Test, which can be completed online or in person. To date, aspiring drivers or rides would need to pay a Learner Permit Test Online fee of \$25.40 and a Learner Permit Issues fee of \$26 upon successful completion. Both fees will be waived, saving Victorians a total of \$51.40. Aspiring Learner drivers who attend their Learner Permit Test in person will still be required to pay a \$19.60 Appointment fee, \$25.40 Learner Permit Test In-person test fee, or a Motorcycle Learner Test fee which is completed through individual training providers. Car Learner Permit Renewal fees as well as Licence Replacement fees will also remain.

### **Probationary Licence**

To graduate from a Learner to Probationary driver, people must complete three requirements – an eyesight test, the Hazard Perception Test, and the Drive Test. As part of the new Safe Driver Discount program, the \$19.40 Hazard Perception Test fee and the \$113.90 Probationary Licence Issue fee will both be made free of charge. Though drivers will be able to save \$133.30, they will still need to fork out \$105.70 to pay for an Appointment fee, In-person test fee, Drive Test fee, and a Drive Test appointment fee.

### **VicRoads Part-Privatised**

Additionally, Probationary car drivers who under 25 years of age can receive a free three-year full driver licence, if they are able to maintain a good driving record throughout their entire probationary period. Safe drivers who have not incurred demerit points or committed road safety offences in the three years prior to their licence expiring, will be rewarded with the reintroduction of a 25 per cent discount on their licence renewal.

# AOMC CARBON OFFSET PROGRAM

The Association of Motoring Clubs (AOMC) is offering motoring enthusiasts the opportunity to support the environment through a carbon offset scheme. This program enables you to demonstrate a commitment to both the environment and to the preservation of our motoring heritage. It also allows the AOMC to highlight to government that the environment and our heritage fleet can exist in harmony. This will, amongst other benefits, help us to support the current Club Permit system. The annual tax-deductible carbon offset fee for a collectable car is very cheap (\$18 for 3000 km/year and \$36 for 6000 km/year) recognising that our historic cars produce very little greenhouse gas per year.

## Why should you purchase Carbon Offsets?

As an enthusiast you probably have a favourite type of car. You also understand that other people like different cars. Some may like old army jeeps, while others like sleek sports cars. And then there are those who like old trucks or even old Triumphs (your parents or grandparents may have owned one as you were growing up). But there are other people who see old cars as just being out of date, unsafe and unnecessary users of petrol.

We understand that big SUV's produce a lot more greenhouse gas than many of our collectable cars, especially as our collectable cars are only driven occasionally. The scheme developed by the AOMC with Greenfleet enables us to show to government and the general community that we are committed to both the environment and the preservation of our motoring heritage.

Why buy offsets from Greenfleet? This is a widely recognised not for profit organisation that, since 1997, has planted over 10 million trees and created and is maintaining over 500 biodiverse forests. It is also recognised by the Government with accreditation to provide tax deductible receipts.

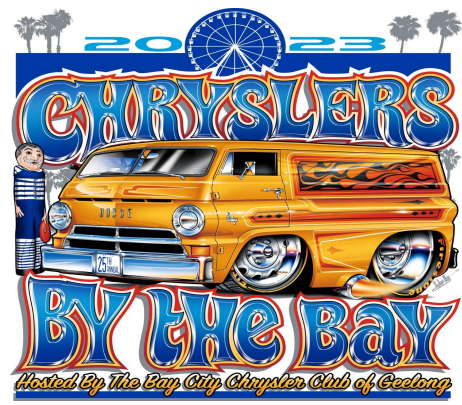
