IMPROVING PEDESTRIAN SAFETY ALONG THE GREAT OCEAN ROAD

Great Ocean Road locals and visitors alike can now enjoy safer strolls as upgrades have been made to pedestrian crossings in the coastal town of Apollo Bay.

Works to improve safety for pedestrians on the Great Ocean Road began in July 2023. Starting in Apollo Bay, crews have upgraded two existing pedestrian crossings to raised crossings, ensuring better safety measures for pedestrians.

Road safety assessments in the area identified six crashes in the Apollo Bay township in the three-year period between October 2016 and November 2019. Some of these incidents involved pedestrians on foot or occurred near pedestrian crossings.

Raised crossings, also known as 'wombat crossings', encourage drivers to slow down as they approach pedestrian crossings, significantly reducing the risk of crashes and increasing safety in high pedestrian activity areas.

Similar pedestrian crossing upgrades are also planned for the township of Lorne.

These upgrades are part of the Victorian Government's investment of \$255 million to upgrade the Great Ocean Road and its inland routes.

THE ECONOMIC VALUE OF THE HISTORIC & CLASSIC MOTORING INDUSTRY IN AUSTRALIA

The Australian Motor Heritage Foundation (AMHF) is conducting a survey of heritage vehicle owners to put a figure on the contribution that the heritage vehicle sector makes to the Australian economy. The survey is being conducted on the Survey Monkey platform by the economics advisory firm, The Mercurius Group. The survey should take less than 10 minutes to complete and is **totally anonymous**. WATER DISPLACEMENT #40 OR WD-40

Even though this is a re-run of an article the club did in 2016, it is still interesting to know what WD-40 can be used for. WD-40 was developed in 1953 by Norman Larsen, founder of the Rocket Chemical Company, in San Diego, California. 'WD-40' is abbreviated from the term 'Water Displacement, 40th formula', suggesting it was the result of Larsen's 40th attempt to create the product. The spray, composed of various hydrocarbons, was originally designed to be used by Convair to protect the outer skin and, the paper-thin balloon tanks of the Atlas missile from rust and corrosion. These stainless-steel fuel tanks were so fragile that when empty they had to be kept inflated with nitrogen to prevent them from collapsing. WD-40 was later found to have many house hold uses and was made available to consumers in San Diego in 1958.....

- 1. Try WD-40 on your stovetop. Voila! It's now shinier than it is ever been. You will be amazed.
- 2. Protects silver from tarnishing.
- 3. Bug guts will eat away the finish on your car if not removed quickly! Use WD-40!
- 4. Removes road tar and grime from cars.
- 5. Cleans and lubricates guitar strings.
- 6. Gives floors that 'just-waxed' sheen without making it slippery.
- 7. Keeps flies off cows.
- 8. Restores and cleans chalkboards.
- 9. Removes lipstick stains.
- 10. Loosens stubborn zippers and
- 11. Untangles jewelry chains.
- 12. Removes stains from stainless steel sinks appliances.
- 13. Removes dirt and grime from the barbecue grill.
- 14. Keeps ceramic or terra cotta garden pots from oxidizing.
- 15. Removes tomato stains from clothing
- 16. Keeps glass shower doors free of water spots.
- 17. Camouflages scratches in ceramic and marble floors.
- 18. Keeps scissors working smoothly.
- 19. Lubricates noisy door hinges on vehicles and doors in homes.
- 20. Gives a children's play gym slide a shine for a super-fast slide.
- 21. Lubricates gear shift and mower deck lever for ease of handling on riding mowers.
- 22. Rids kid's rocking chairs and swings of squeaky noises.
- 23. Lubricates tracks in sticking home windows and makes them easier to open.
- 24. Spraying an umbrella stem makes it easier to open and close.
- 25. Restores and cleans padded leather dashboards in vehicles, as well as vinyl bumpers.
- 26. Restores and cleans roof racks on vehicles.
- 27. Lubricates and stops squeaks in electric fans.
- 28. Lubricates wheel sprockets on tricycles, wagons, and bicycles for easy handling.
- 29. Lubricates fan belts on washers and dryers and keeps them running smoothly.
- 30. Keeps rust from forming on saws and saw blades, and other tools.
- 31. Removes splattered grease on stove.
- 32. Keeps bathroom mirror from fogging.
- 33. Lubricates prosthetic limbs.
- 34. Keeps pigeons off the balcony (they hate the smell).
- 35. Removes all traces of duct tape.
- 36. Folks even spray it on their arms, hands, and knees to relieve Arthritis pain.
- 37. Florida's favorite use is: "cleans and removes love bugs from grills and bumpers."

- 44. It removes black scuff marks from the kitchen floor! Use WD-40 for those nasty tar and scuff marks on flooring.




COLAC COLLECTABLE CAR CLUB INC. RUNS CALENDAR (SEPTEMBER, 2023 – JANUARY, 2024)
